

Micah chapter 2

What sins are the people of Judah being accused of in verses 1, 2, 8, and 9 ? Are all the people of the nation under indictment, or just certain groups?

What judgment is proclaimed against them in verses 3, 4, 5, and 10?

In which verses does Micah speak of restoration following their judgment?

Micah chapter 4

Which people will be blessed by God? [1-4] What will distinguish the descendants of Israel? [5]

There seems to be a time warp of sorts in verses 6-13: verses 6-8 seem to be still focussed on the distant future; 9-11 don't seem to be compatible with the other events (in 6-8 and 12-13) – what could Micah be describing here?

Micah chapter 6

Who is called to witness God's complaints against His people? [1-2] What plea does God make to His people? [3-5]

In verses 6 and 7 Micah seems to be prividing the people's response to God's interrogation; how did they imagine they might appease His anger? What attitude do they exhibit? In verses 8 and 9 Micah gives us God's answer to the people.

In 10-12 God presents a catalog of the people's sins; what is included in that list?

God describes [13-15] what judgments he has decided upon for the people because of their sins; have those judgments been executed, or are they still pending?

What are the references to Omri and Ahab all about? [16]
